#### Teachers' Report:

#### WRAPSC Report:

- The most recent WRAPSC meeting focused predominantly on high schools

## Fundraising Report:

- Swap Night: April 19, donated books, board/card games, and puzzles available for free. Popcorn, Juice, Chocolates available for sale, donation jar present. In addition, Lost and Found items laid out for retrieval.
- Dance-a-thon: May 11.
- Fun Fair: Scheduled for June 8th, from 5:00-7:00 pm It has been brought to our attention that Courtland PS's orientation for incoming students is also June 8th. Concerns were raised about scheduling conflicts and parents' willingness/ability to attend. Ultimately due to vendor availability, the Fun Fair will go ahead on the 8th.

- Playground update:
  - Council members have spoken with kindergarten teachers re: what changes should be incorporated into the front playground renovation.
  - Teachers have expressed a desire for less centralized, and more naturalized play structures.
  - We are waiting on information from the WRDSB regarding the services/components they will pay for (e.g. drainage, safety audit)

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#### Other Business:

- **Track and Field Event:** Suddaby will be having a track and field meet on June 22nd, with a rain date of June 23rd. Suddaby WILL NOT be participating in the Regional track meet for the following reasons:
  - To go to regionals, processes from our track meet would need to change. At present, students experience all of the events of track and field, but the staff does not hand out ribbons, keep track of times/distances etc., or divide the students by gender.
  - Running track and field this way allows students to experience the different events without without the pressures of competition
  - Going to regional is a significant commitment from staff in training and paperwork during a busy season.
- Strongstart: There are currently 5 SK students enrolled in Strongstart.
