What do you need to graduate?

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Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
- 3 credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in science
 - l credit in Canadian history
- 1 credit in Canadian geography
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

- New

 I group 1: additional credit in English, or French as a second language, ** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education***
 - New group 2: additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language,** or cooperative education***
 - group 3: additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second language,** or computer studies, or cooperative education***

In addition, students must complete:

- √ 12 optional credits†
- √ 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement

Compulsory Credits

- ▶ English U, C or E
- ▶ Math U, M, C, or E
- Ensure you are meeting Group 1,2 and 3






