- Application fees & deadlines for application will vary
- Must request transcript from Guidance
- OUAC can transfer marks for Bishop's, Concordia, McGill, UBC, UVictoria, Dalhousie, SFU, UCalgary
- Some Canadian universities/colleges may visit the K-W area

American Colleges & Universities

- Closest site for writing SAT is St. John's Kilmarnock, otherwise must go out of town (e.g. Toronto)
- Check out university and college websites for programs and application instructions
- Most use the Common App; application very detailed; requires letters of reference and essay - start this summer!
- Watch deadlines Early admission & early acceptance deadline is December 1st; otherwise application is due at end of December. Let your counsellor know early if you are considering applying

Things to Consider

- Program requirements? Prerequisites; cut-off averages; other criteria, e.g. audition, portfolio
- Location? Home or away; size and location of city
- Co-op or internship opportunities?
- Campus Factors? Size; atmosphere on campus; scholarships; cost of program
- Extra-curricular activities clubs, sports, etc.
- Start date some programs have start dates other than September
