## Playground Replacement Planning

- Our large playground went through the safety approval process in the spring. It was approved but certain elements did need to be removed in order for it to pass
- It is now time for us to look at long term planning of replacing the large playground
- First step will be to connect with the board safety person who will outline the process
- Consider really pushing the next two years of fundraising to help cover the cost, make it clear there will be a break from fundraisers after that
- Look into grants
- Reach out to corporations/businesses/local developers for donations
- Playground is considered a community accessible structure
- Conestogo just replaced their playground - reach out to them for advice/take a look at theirs


## Fundraising

Freezies

- Freezie day was very successful
- Everyone enjoyed the freezie, it went well with teachers coming to get the freezies when it worked best for their class schedule
- Thank you to Melissa Turner for taking care of buying the freezies, freezing them and dropping them off at the school (drop off first half in the morning and second half at noon)
- Total funds collected was $\$ 444.20$ (cost of freezies to be deducted from this number)


## Food Truck

- Only two trucks showed up, line ups were long but still seemed enjoyable
- Arts night was very well attended by students, parents, family members, staff and even community members
- Choir performances went very well
- Total funds raised were $\$ 345$
