#### WRAPSC Update (April 2 Meeting Update)

- Main focus was a presentation from Stephen McCrae, System Administrator from the board, and the topic was Individual Education Plans (slideshow was sent out with email from Lisa)
  - Provided an overview of the planning team within schools and the sources to support the development of an IEP.
  - Discussed components of the IEP: accommodations (instructional, environmental, assessment)
  - Mentioned programs and courses with alternative expectations which outline learning related to skill development in areas not represented in the Ontario curriculum (alternative continuing education)
  - IEPs are a working document, are initiated within 30 days of the new school year and formally reviewed again at the start of a new semester/term
  - What if your child's needs are not being met? What if the IEP is not being followed?
    - Contact the teacher, the special education teacher, the VP/Principal.
      Above that would be Stephen (speaker) and then the superintendent.
    - Encouraged parents/supporters to have the conversation and not be afraid to ask questions >> ask yourself if you are comfortable with not having the conversation if your child's needs are not being met.
  - A recommendation was to ask our Principal/VP or the school's special education teacher to explain the student support process model, the Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC), and the In School Support Team (ISST) to the School Council. >> perhaps this could be a future Principal update topic?
- Other topics/items:
  - A Safe Caring Inclusive Schools (SCIS) group is a mandatory group that should be at every school. Do we have one? Is there a parent on this group? If so, how were they selected? How can that parent liaise with School Council?
  - Raffles WRDSB is not able to get one license for everyone to use, each school council you must get own
  - Baked goods you can sell as a fundraiser but they must be individually packaged and have a full list of ingredients
  - Volunteers in the school need a vulnerable sector check as there is a chance they will be alone with a child on school property
