Step 1: Learn about all options for high school (November-January) -Attend Open Houses -Look on wrdsb.ca for more information -Talk with your family, teachers and friends

Step 2: Applying to Special Programs (January-February) -IB, Enhanced, Fast Forward

Step 3: Choose your courses (February)
-Choose which classes are right for you!
-Discuss these choices with your family and teachers

- English (Academic or Applied)

Streaming in High School

All Core subjects (English, Math, Science, French, etc.) have 2 main streams

Academic

-Recommended to have over a 70% average in the subject
-Emphasis on theoretical, abstract applications of the essential concepts
-Lead towards university and college degrees after high school

Applied

-Emphasis on practical, concrete applications of the essential concepts -Lead to senior courses preparing students for college, apprenticeship, skilled trades and the workplace **Questions??**

- Preston Enhanced (Preston must be your home school to apply) PHS

Fast Forward

- Focuses on helping students acquire the skills needed to get a job after high school.
- These students will be identified by our Guidance department and conversations will take place with parents about the opportunities presented in Fast Forward
- Jacob Hespeler S.S. is where the program is located. OPEN HOUSE- Wednesday, November 28th, 6:00 pm (Jacob Hespeler library)

Eastwood Arts Program

- Focuses on Arts programs: visual, vocal, instrumental, drama, design
- Take core classes such as English, Math, Science, Geography
 - academic and applied available for each

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- High level academic program 83% or higher in every subject strongly recommended
- Graduate high school with an IB certificate
- You can write AP exams for university/college credits
- You must apply for a chance to be in this program
- Glenview Park S.S. is where the program is located OPEN HOUSE- Tuesday November 20th, 2018 @6:30pm
- IB @ Glenview Park

Preston Enhanced

- Academic level classes for all subjects, looking for 80% or more in most classes
- Extra opportunities such as field trips, guest speakers, etc.
- You may write AP exams in Grade 12 for University credits.
- Need to apply to be in this program
- Runs out of Preston, you can only apply if you would attend PHS regularly OPEN HOUSE- Thursday November 29th, 6:30-9pm
- Enhanced Information Thursday November 29th, @ 6:30-9:00
- Preston Guidance EP and AP -

Goals of the Enhanced Program:

 to provide academic programming throughout high school at an increased depth and pace for gifted and extremely capable learners as preparation for post-secondary destinations

- to allow for extension of learning and diversity in intellectual stimulation
- to create a stimulating environment for intellectual inquiry and growth
- to offer the opportunity to obtain Advanced Placement credit(s)

Characteristics of Enhanced Learners:

- rapid rate of processing information and linking concepts
- creative thinking reaching beyond society's accepted and/or expected pattern
- insightful response and awareness in social issues
- motivated to learn independently; takes initiative for own learning
- ability to accept or create new learning environments
- above average academic ability often paired with strong academic results
