

BACK-TO-SCHOOL KIT INFORMATION SEPTEMBER 2016

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As one school year ends, we also begin to think about the beginning of the next. Often parents ask us for suggestions when purchasing back-to-school supplies for students. The staff members of Woodland Park have outlined purchase suggestions for you. Parents, please remember that the purchase of these materials is optional and basic supplies will continue to be provided by the school, however, any assistance is greatly appreciated.

Commercially produced, personalized Woodland Park planners have been ordered for students in grades 1-8 and all students are expected to use these planners. The cost is \$7.00 per planner.

*Students in grades 7 and 8 have the privilege of using lockers for their belongings. Locks are available to purchase from the school for \$5.00

DRESS CODE

One aspect of a positive learning environment is the appropriate attire of all students from kindergarten to grade 8. We request your cooperation by discussing the following expectations with your child and by encouraging them to adopt a positive, responsible approach to their school attire:

No inappropriate writing or graphics on clothing

Skirts and shorts must be mid-thigh in length (or as measured with a 10 cm inseam)

No low-cut or cropped (showing cleavage or midriff area) tops – tops and bottoms must meet



No undergarments are to be showing

Straps on tops must cover undergarment straps.

No hats, bandanas, or gang wear.
