Principal's Message

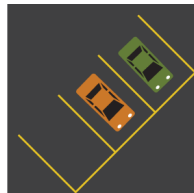

Parking Lot



Our parking lot is for school board staff. It is not safe for parents to drop off their students in this lot. There are many parking spaces available adjacent to the school on several streets.

Playing on Playground before School is Not Allowed

The reason for this rule is that students are not supervised until 8:50 a.m. by our staff. It is not safe for students to use the playground equipment even if their parents arrive with them. The reason for this is that it is not reasonable for teachers to identify which student belongs to which parent if they are allowed on the structure. A sign is posted on the playground describing this rule.

No Dogs on School Property



In order to ensure the safety of all of our families this rule needs to be respected at Westvale. Some children have anxiety around animals and we must ensure that they feel safe when they are on school property.

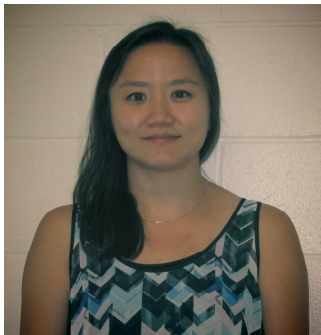
Partners in Learning Program

This is the fourth year that our school has worked in collaboration with researchers from Wilfrid Laurier University. This year 20 Grade 2's and 3's (involved in this study) will be pre-tested in the next few weeks. All information collected for this study will be kept completely confidential and anonymous.

Data will be used for publication purposes in academic journals and will be presented in an aggregate form at all times. Westvale school will not be mentioned in publications and data will not be circulated within school boards. In addition, anonymous data may be passed between the named members of the academic team

for academic research purposes only. All of our research assistants have up-to-date Vulnerable Sector Police Checks and have experience working with children, as per Research Ethics Board (REB) requirements. Letters will be sent home by the researchers to the families involved in this project on Friday.

about our Library rules.*

Dear Families,

Our libraries are open for another school year. We invite all students to visit the library to borrow books for independent reading and research projects. Students are encouraged to borrow from all areas of the library. A library clerk will be available at your school to help your child use the library. A timetable outside the door will let you know when the library is open.

Students may borrow books for up to a three-week loan period and may exchange them as frequently as they wish. Our loan standards are as follows:

<u>Students in:</u>	<u>May borrow:</u>
JK & SK	up to 2 books
Grades 1 & 2	up to 3 books
Grades 3 to 8	up to 4 books

Students are responsible for the books that they sign out. To avoid loss or damage to books, students are encouraged to:

- Carry library books in a book bag or knapsack,
- Keep food and drinks (liquids) away from books,
- Store the book in a safe spot at home, away from young children and pets,
- Return all borrowed books on or before the due date,
- Return overdue books before borrowing another item.

Should a book become lost or damaged, please notify the school's library clerk. A small fee will be charged:

Soft Covered Item: \$5.00 Hard-Covered Item: \$10.00

Research and reading can take place outside of the school library. Students are invited to visit the *Library Learning Commons* <http://library.wrdsb.ca> at any time from home or from school to continue their learning online. From the home page Library Learning Commons website connect to the Virtual Library to access our extensive online collections of encyclopedias, eBooks, research databases and streamed media.

WRDSB Libraries is excited to announce that we are now offering eBooks and audiobooks through OverDrive. Check it out on the Library Learning Commons website.
