## Principal's Report – Jodie Hancox-Meyer

- Progress Reports and Kindergarten Initial Observations of Learning went home on Friday, November 20<sup>th</sup>. This was likely the most unique and challenging set of report cards that teachers have ever had to write given the circumstances that COVID19 has thrown at us. There is not official time set aside for parent-teacher interviews this year, but as always, parents are always encouraged to reach out to the child's teacher to discuss their child's progress via phone, email, etc.
  - a. There are gaps over where kids would have been normally because of the months when school was closed. Even now that we are back there is less time in the instructional day in general due to early dismissal and late arrival in order to promote distancing. Handwashing and washroom breaks are also taking longer, to promote safety, which is removing time from the instructional day.
  - b. Teachers are meeting the kids where they are at.
  - c. Teachers at Westvale are collaborating with the teachers from the previous grade to find out where the previous grade's teacher left off and to help kids catch up on the curriculum they missed out on.
  - d. Some kids are at the expected levels for their grade, others are much further behind.
  - e. Expectation is that teachers will be working to fix this gap for more than just this school year.
- Our transition to having our classes line up for the beginning and end of the day on the tarmac has been relatively successful and will allow us to proactively not have to deal with line ups travelling through deep snow and snow plow piles. Once again, our students and their families showed great flexibility with adapting to this change. We continue to remind families about giving the line ups some "space" and having the adults wait on the periphery of the tarmac to allow for adequate physical distancing. We also continue to remind those who are dropping off and picking up students to wear a mask while on school property.
- This morning, we had the whole school enjoy a virtual performance by Luca Patuelli (also known as Lazylegz). Luca has turned his physical disability into a gift to share with others and his message of "no excuses, no limits" was really well received by our students. Luca has developed his own personal dance style using his incredible upper body strength and his crutches and he demonstrated this, along with teaching the kids some dance moves, all while a DJ played music. Along with being featured at Westvale P.S., Luca has also appeared on the Ellen Show, So You Think You Can Dance Canada and America's Got Talent.
- I would like to thank Liz Kristensen, who has done something small but very impactful on behalf of School Council. After our meeting last month, Liz approached me and

volunteered to write thank you letters to some unsung heroes on behalf of Council. Together, we came up with a list including our 2 crossing guards, the 2 EAs who are running Nutrition for Learning, our custodial staff and our secretaries. These little cards were delivered and I can personally vouch for how meaningful they were to their recipients. Thanks, Liz, for doing this small but mighty deed of kindness. I would also like to share that there is an anonymous letter writer who has twice posted the most beautiful and articulate letters of thanks to the whole staff on the outer doors of our school. It is hard to express just how much these meant to each and every one of us as we have navigated through a very challenging fall to date. Thank you and bless you, anonymous letter-writer!

- I have made arrangements with Paul Davis to do a virtual workshop on social media and internet safety with our junior students during the day on January 26<sup>th</sup>. Our students in our grade 3/4 classes up to grade 6 will participate as Paul's workshop is live-streamed into our classrooms. Unfortunately, there isn't a way to include all of our online learners as they are spread across many different classes with many different teachers out there, but we are hoping to be able to plan a "parent" workshop in partnership with School Council that same evening, which parents of both in-person and online learners can participate. My hope is that more conversation about this can be had tonight and we can move forward with those plans.
- On December 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> we are going to have a COVID-safe food drive at Westvale. We are aware of the increased need in our community this year and want to be able to help out. This drive is taking place under the leadership of Miss Seergobin and many of our staff are volunteering with the many jobs that need doing to make the initiative run smoothly and the food delivered to the Food Bank. More information will be forthcoming on School Day. In a nutshell, donations will happen during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up at the outside gym doors off of the tarmac. This way, we will be able to safely collect food without having students bringing it into their classrooms. We are excited to be doing this and being able to support those in need in some small way.
  - a. Instead of being done over a week to 10 days, it will be two days of collection only
- You have likely read the WRDSB announcements that came out last week around the significant changes that will occur starting this year when buses are cancelled on inclement weather days. If buses are cancelled, all school will now automatically be closed for in-person learning. Teachers will make learning opportunities available on their Google classroom or D2L Brightspace platform for students to do some virtual learning on those days. The learning provided by teachers will not be synchronous or "live" but teachers will be available to students and their families during the school day and will be posting learning activities. This decision was made for safety reasons because on severe weather days, quite often staff who live outside of the city are not able to safely make it into work and we end up having to combine classes to ensure we've got adequate teacher coverage. With COVID safety guidelines, we can no longer do this. The WRDSB will make every attempt to make school closure announcements by 6 a.m. on those days.

- a. Learning opportunities will be provided, but children will not be required to complete the activities

#### **Teacher Report – Marisa Moser**

- The past month seems to have flown by. We have just finished writing progress reports and are now focussed on more learning ahead. In terms of events for students, we held a whole school virtual Remembrance Day ceremony thanks to Mr. Bailey's grade 6 class, Mlle Moser and Mrs. Morley. We also made wreaths and put them on the front lawn for the community to help us in remembering the fallen soldiers.
- We had a spirit day for anti bullying last week where students dressed in Pink.
- Coming up this week we have another spirit day of Crazy Hair Day/Crazy Sock Day for students and staff to take part in.
- For the month of December, we will be doing a covid-friendly version of the Westvale Wow's that students can earn for demonstrating kindness to others and within their classrooms.
- We will also be playing whole school virtual music bingo on the last day of school to celebrate the holidays!

#### **Treasurer's Report – Rick Foucault**

- \$53 in revenue from Mabel's Labels

- Opening balance was just over 9k
- Have just under \$5700 in commitments (includes our 3k minimum balance)
- Available balance just over \$3400

- Still waiting for the year over year rollover from the Board to finalize the numbers
