Principal's Report

Principal's Report for School Council January 27th, 2021

1. Because of the extension of the school closure and virtual learning, we had to postpone two presentations we had planned via Zoom for the Earth Rangers (grades 1 – 6) and Paul Davis (grades $\frac{3}{4}$ - 6). The logistics of continuing with all students learning in in their individual homes was just too complex. Both presentations will be re-booked when in-person learning resumes.
2. We are staying tuned for when in-person learning might resume - right now we know that distance learning will continue for all in-person learners until Feb 10th, with a potential return to school on Feb 11th.
3. The date by which parents can decide to switch their child's mode of learning was extended from Jan 115th to Jan 29th. To switch from in-person to DL (distance learning) or vice-versa, parents must call the main office and complete an electronic form. Whichever mode of learning is chosen, that will remain the mode for the rest of the school year. With each opportunity that families may decide to change modes of learning (like happened in October), there is a high probability that the school will have to re-organize and staff assignments and students' teachers may change. This occurs to keep classes numbers relatively balanced and also to abide by the primary hard cap of 20. Any impacted families will receive notice from the school about this as the dates for the new modes of learning get closer (March 4th for DL switching to in-person, March 8th for in-person to DL).
4. Term 1 report cards are due to go home on February 17th. For our distance learners, I'm assuming that reports will be mailed. Hopefully our in-person learners will be back at that point and reports will be send home directly with students. If not, then we'll likely be looking at mailing them as well.
5. We received a \$1000 grant from President's Choice to support our Westvale NFL program - these funds have been forwarded directly to NFL to support the purchase of healthy snacks for our classroom nutrition bins.

6. Despite the school closure and some pandemic-induced logistical challenges, we are slowly seeing some work being done on Kindergarten room 8. This room has been identified by facility services as needing some upgrades, including being painted (over the holiday break), and the planned installation of large whiteboards, along with moving the coat hooks and cubbies into the hallway outside the room to increase space for learning inside the room.
