  - Students would sign out and return when finished.
  - Grade 6s would assume some responsibility
  - Cost is approximately \$1,000.
  - Motioned by Robyn, seconded by Summer/Becky.
  - Voted and passed.
- Log Jam replacement

- Structure has been removed as it was becoming unsafe (vandalism & natural decomposition)
- Opportuntiy to replace with new learning area/play structure
- Can be paid for out of greening funds so long as it meets critera
- Administration will ask teachers what they would like to see in that area

## AROUND THE SCHOOL

- 1. Staffing:
  - a) Interim Principal starting Monday, October 3 to November 25- Welcome to Susan Schaffner, a
    retired administrator who has supported the system as an interim principal for a few years.
    Hopefully by the end of November a permanent principal will be hired, interviewing process is
    ongoing to fill admin positions in schools.
  - b) Still hiring for 30 EA hours.
  - c) We are happy to announce that Vickie Thompson is the permanent second secretary at WTT, Ursula Riedl is still the amazing head secretary!
  - d) Looking for paid Parking Lot person to support safety at WTT.
  - e) Looking for Strong Start volunteers, commitment is a minimum of 60 minutes a week- must have training that is provided.
  - f) Hiring for SMACA (lunch supervisors) hours are now completed.
- 2. Reorganization-Board Directed- never ideal after first day of school, based on numbers once students actually attend in September, student movement kept as minimal as possible.
- 3. Events:
  - a) Photo Day-October 20 with Retakes October 22.
  - b) TSN Soccer- after schools, 50 students signed up.
  - c) Terry Fox Run- all day during school-Thursday, September 29- option to wear red.
  - d) National Day for Truth and Reconciliation- Friday, September 30- option to wear orange-orange sticker provided for all students.
  - e) Arts Night- Booked for May 11th with Food Trucks lined up.
  - f) Fire Drill Week #1- 3 Fire Drills and Lockdown completed-out in about 3 minutes.
- 4. Nutrition For Learning- bins filled weekly to support all students.

- 5. Spirit Wear- asking that each student will be provided with a Trailblazer T-shirt so that all students can participate in Trailblazer Tuesdays, courtesy of School Council, if passed. There is no scheduled other student spiritwear sale at this time but we could see if there is interest after the T-shirts.
- 6. Fenced area- new-to support students with safety concerns.
- 7. Rainbell- didn't have enough staff to supervise to start the year. With SMACA hired we can now revisit.
